The University of Colorado Anschutz Medical Campus, one of four campuses in the University of Colorado System, is the major academic medical center in the Rocky Mountain region. The Anschutz Medical Campus is home to the University of Colorado Hospital, Children's Hospital Colorado and a new Veterans Affairs Hospital, making it one of the largest and most comprehensive biomedical research and clinical care centers in the western United States.

Job Summary:

This psychologist (PhD or PsyD) will be faculty in the Division of Hematology and will serve the clinical needs of the Blood Disorders and Cellular Therapies Center on the Anschutz Medical Campus. This population includes those with hematologic malignancies such as leukemia, lymphoma and multiple myeloma, as well as those undergoing bone marrow transplant or treatment with immune effector therapy such as those using Chimeric Antigen Receptor T-cell (CAR-T) to treat cancer.

This is a clinical position and is highly integrated with the medical team. The psychologist will provide assessment including pre-transplant evaluation, health and behavior interventions, and psychotherapy to individuals and families across both the inpatient and outpatient environment. This psychologist will join a dedicated psychosocial team comprised of psychologists, social workers, and spiritual care providers and will spend a portion of their time coordinating with the medical and psychosocial teams to assure the needs of patients and families are met. The expectation is that this is a predominately clinical position. There will be opportunities for teaching, scholarship, and research as part of the assistant professor role; however, this position includes no protected time for non-clinical activities.

ESSENTIAL RESPONSIBILITIES

Contributes as part of the UCH multidisciplinary inpatient psychiatry consultation team including:

- Provide Behavioral Health Services for inpatients at University of Colorado Hospital and outpatients in the Blood Disorders and Cellular Therapy Center for example brief psychotherapies, adjustment to illness, trauma informed approaches, safety evaluations, pre-transplant evaluations and capacity evaluations for medical decision making

- Assist with unit/patient/staff relational dynamics and provide recommendations to help in cases of difficult patient interactions, including the creation and implementation of behavioral care plans
- Develop educational programming and present at Division of Hematology Grand Rounds
- Participate in quality review activities and process improvement
- Contribute to the academic advancement of the discipline
- Keep abreast of the latest developments in field, both academically and through applied skills
- Maintain collaborative engagement with the medical and psychosocial teams
- Maintain eligibility for SOM faculty appointment

Specific Additional Responsibilities or Duties

- Occasional crisis intervention for difficult patient situations
