

Psychiatrist, Psychosocial Oncology Program

The University of Washington Department of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences is seeking candidates for a fulltime faculty position to join our Psychosocial Oncology Program.

Our integrated psychosocial oncology program is built on a multidisciplinary collaborative care model. Responsibilities will include being a proactive team member at the Fred Hutchinson Cancer Center (FHCC), as well as clinical consultation and treatment of oncology patients in the ambulatory setting. Experience in consultation-liaison psychiatry and multidisciplinary collaboration are essential. The successful candidate will have expertise in psycho-oncology, diagnostic assessment, psychotherapy, psychopharmacology, and behavioral therapies. Applicants with strong academic potential in research or education will be preferred.

Providers are afforded up to a full day per week of administrative/academic time on the service.

The FHCC, which is ranked as one of the top cancer centers nationally, is home to three Nobel Prize winners and the only National Cancer Institute Designated comprehensive cancer center in the Washington, Wyoming, Alaska, Montana, Idaho (WWAMI) region.
